How It Works

6:00 p.m. — Cocktail Preview

7:00 p.m. — First Draw Begins

7:55 p.m. — Jump the Line Winner Announced

When your draw ticket is pulled and your name is called, you will have two minutes to tell the volunteer at the table nearest to you which piece you would like to take home.

After we pull approximately 20 draw tickets, we'll have a short break to remove work from display and wrap it up for you to pick up later in the evening.

If you miss your name being called in the two minute window, we will call it again at the end of the evening.

Jump the Line Ticket Draw

For \$25, you have a chance to win another piece of art AND JUMP THE LINE to make the very next selection! The winner will be announced after the first break. Tickets are available at the front desk.

After-Draw Sale

At the end of the evening ticket holders will have an opportunity to purchase remaining works for \$200.

What Do the Blue Dots Mean?

The labels with a blue dot indicate that the artist would like the work returned if it is not chosen in the draw, meaning these works will not be offered in the after-draw sale.

Curator's Foreword

Let's start at the beginning. Station Gallery was established by forward-thinking artists and community leaders who envisioned the cultural potential of Whitby and the Durham Region as a whole. Whitby Arts Incorporated transformed a defunct railway building into the pulsating cultural hub we now know as Station Gallery. 




